7 present simple

The time used to refer to events actions and conditions that occur
all the time

It is formed with the verb in the infinitive without the to in the
third person singular it is necessary to add the suffix -s

I lived in Madrid

She likes Cheese

She likes watching movies

I don't live in Madrid

She doesn't love running

Present continuous

The form of the verb used for actions or events that are happening or unfolding now

Its formed with the auxiliary verb in the present + the main verb with the suffix -ing

The kids are watching TV

I am making a cake

She is listening to music

She isn't doing her part

Where are you doing?

Present perfect

The form of the verb used for actions or events that have been completed or that have occurred in a period of time so far

It is formed using the auxiliary verb in present (have/has) + the past participle of the main verb

- I have studied English
- I have played soccer every Tuesday since 2018
- I have done my homework already
- I have made many mistakes in my life
- I haven't been to Japan

Present perfect continuous

We use the present perfect continuous to talk about an activity completed in the recent past.

It is formed with the verb in the present perfect + the participle of the main verb.

- I have been studying English
- I have been working out a lot
- I have been cleaning the car
- I have been watching a lot of movies
- She hasn't been posting will

past simple

It is used for past actions that occurred at a specific time which can be given by a temporary phrase (yesterday, last year, etc.) or understood from the context.

It is formed with the base verb + suffix *ed*, or with the appropriate form in the case of an irregular verb.

• I studied English

• I didn't do my homework

• We didn't pay that well

• She didn't finish her major

• Where did she stay?

past continuous

Used for an action that someone was doing or an event that was happening at a certain time.

It is formed with the auxiliary of the verb *to be* (*was/were*) + present participle of the main verb

• I was studying English

• I was cleaning the kitchen
