We make the third conditional by using the past perfect after 'if' and then 'would + have + past participle' in the second part of the sentence:

if + past perfect, ...would + have + past participle

If clause	Main clause
If + Past Perfect tense	would/could/might + past participle

If I had won the lottery,

I would have traveled around the world.

It talks about the past. It's used to describe a situation that didn't happen, and the result.
