You can write **had not** or **hadn't**

Laura had not understood the lesson

## Past perfect

The past perfect tense for talking about something that happened before something else

### Example

We were shocked to discover that someone had graffiti'd on our front door

Past simple we were shocked to discover

Past perfect someone had graffiti'd on our front door

The teacher explained about past perfect while the student had done the test

The past perfect, also called the ~~the~~ superfect is a verb tense used to talk about actions that were completed before some point in the past

The past perfect simple is used to describe one action that happened before another action in the past

After Sophie had finished her work, she went to lunch

Past perfect: Sophie

Past simple: She

I washed the floor when the painter had gone

Past perfect: the painter...

Past simple: I washed...
