Past Perfect

The past perfect tense is for talking about something that happened before something else.

Example: We were shocked to discover that someone had graffiti'd on our front door.

Past simple: We were shocked to discover!

Past perfect: Someone had graffiti'd our front door.

The teacher explained about past perfect while the student had done the test.

The past perfect, also called the plp perfect, is a verb tense used to talk about actions that were completed before some point in the past.

The past perfect tense is for talking

happened before another action in the past

After Sofie had finished her work,
she went to lunch.

Past Perfect = Sofie...

Past Simple = She...

I washed the floor when the painter had
gone

Past perfect the painter

Past simple I washed...

Subject + had + verb (participle) + complement

Juan had spoken English with his friends

They had written to family a letter

about their situation Laura / eat

Laura and Peter had eaten pizza

John had to write a poem

Subject + ~~was~~ + ~~not~~ + Verb (participle) +
complement

~~was~~ had NOT spoken English with ~~his~~
~~friends~~

They had ~~not~~ written to family a letter
about their situation

~~was~~ hadn't spoke English with ~~his~~
~~friends~~

~~you~~ ~~can~~ ~~write~~ HAD NOT ~~on~~ HADN'T

Laura / understand / the lesson

~~Laura had not understood the lesson~~

Past Perfect

A firmative: I had spoken English

Negative: I had not spoken English
hadn't

Questions: Had I spoken English
