

BE USED TO

IF you are used to something, you have often done it before or experienced it. If you are not used to something, it is new or difficult for you.

Structure = be used to + noun phrase or verb-ing form

Negative = be not used to

- I am used to getting up early in the morning
- I don't mind it.

Examples:

- I'm used to speaking French
- She is used to sleeping early
- I'm used to reading a book per month
- I'm used to playing guitar
- I'm used to traveling abroad
- I'm used to paying my bills
- I'm used to fighting with my friend
- I'm used to going to the shopping
- I'm used to eating like I do
- I'm used to listening to radio
- I don't think Tom's strange I'm used to him

GET USED TO

structure =

Get used to + something / someone

Get used to + verb ing

If you get used to something you become accustomed to it is no longer unusual or strange

Get used to is a process of becoming used to something

Exemplos

I got used to his Scottish accent

I got used to walking

- I'm get used to speaking French
- I'm get used to sleeping early

- I'm get used to traveling abroad

USED TO

used to state verb infinitive refers to a habits
of the past in the simple tenses. it is used only in

past habits
if you used to do something you did it for
a period of time in the past, but you
don't do it any more

- we used to live there when I was a child
past states

we also say used to express that existed
in the past but doesn't exist now. states are not
action. we express states with stative verbs
such as have believe know and like

- She is used to playing guitar here
- I get used to playing guitar here
- we used to play guitar here

Run very fast

- She is used to running very fast
- we get used to (pl) running very fast
- I get used to (pl) run very fast

Eat hamburger

- He is used to eating hamburger
- I get used to eating hamburger
- we used to eat hamburger

Drink water

- You are used to drinking water
- I get used to drinking water
- she used to drink water

Paint animals

- She is used to painting animals
- they get used to painting animals
- we used to paint animal

listen to rock music

- she is used to listening to rock music
- I get used to listening to rock music
- we used to listen to rock music
