2. Take

- We can get a cab back to the hotel.

3. Receive

- Did you get my email yesterday?
- She gets a beautiful necklace for her birthday.

4. Buy

- We must get some milk. There isn't any left.
- Shall we get some fruit too.

5. Become

- It's getting colder. Put on your jacket.
- You can get better at English by practicing.

7. Understand

- I didn't get what he said. Did you?

- He got the joke but I didn't.

8. Make something

- you should get your hand hair cut.
It's really long.

- we're getting the car checked before
our holiday.
