THIRD CONDITIONAL

We make the third conditional by using the past perfect after 'if' and then 'would have' + past participle in the second part of the sentence:

if + past perfect, ...would + have + past participle

If clause	Main clause
If + Past Perfect tense	would/could/might + have + participle
If I had won the lottery,	I would have traveled around the world

It talks about the past. It's used to describe a situation that didn't happen, and to imagine the result of this situation. If she **had studied**, she **would have passed** the exam (but, we know she didn't study and so she didn't pass)

If I **hadn't eaten** so much, I **wouldn't have felt** sick (but I did eat a lot, and so I did feel sick)

If we **had taken** a taxi, we **wouldn't have missed** the plane

She **wouldn't have been** tired if she **had gone** to bed earlier

She **would have become** a teacher if she **had gone** to university

• *If they had left earlier, they would have arrived on time.*

• *If I hadn't been so busy, I could have helped you.*
Si no hubiese estado tan ocupado, te podría haber ayudado.
