VERB TO BE.

The "To be" is a verb used to describe something or someone.

The most common use of the to be verb is to talk about names, age, feeling, nationalities, and professions.

Example!

NAME: My name is Nicolas.

AGE: I am 12 years old.

Feeling: I am very Happy.

Nationality: My nationality is Colombian.

Profession: My profession is student.

Mary is sad.

The students are intelligent.

THEY ARE,

EXAMPLE!

The cat is beautiful.

The doctors are tired. They are tired.

Mary and Peter are boy friends.

Mary is punctual.

EXAMPLE!

• THE LION IS MY FAVORITE ANIMAL.

• IT IS MY FAVORITE ANIMAL.

AFFIRMATIVE: SHE IS HAPPY.

NEGATIVE: WE ARE NOT ENGINEERS!

WE ARE NOT ENGINEERS!

• AFFIRMATIVE: PETER IS TALL.

NEGATIVE: PETER IS NOT TALL / PETER ISN'T TALL.

• AFFIRMATIVE: SARA IS SMALL.

NEGATIVE: SARA IS NOT SMALL. / SARA ISN'T SMALL.

QUESTION: IS SARA SMALL?

• AFFIRMATIVE: THE STUDENTS IS WISE.

NEGATIVE: THE STUDENTS ARE NOT WISE / THE STUDENTS AREN'T WISE.

QUESTION: ARE THE STUDENTS WISE?

• **QUESTION:** IS the teacher elegant,
ANSWER: (affirmative) Yes, He is ~~is~~ yes,
the teacher is elegant.

ANSWER: (negative) Not, He is not/not,
the teacher is not elegant.

• **Affirmative:** walter is a baker.

Negative: walter is not a baker.

QUESTION: IS walter a baker?

ANSWER: (Affirmative): Yes, walter is
a baker.

ANSWER: (Negative) Not, walter is
not a baker.

VERB TO BE.

AFFIRMATIVE.

NEGATIVE.

I **AM NOT**,
YOU **AREN'T**,
HE **ISN'T**,
SHE **ISN'T**,
IT **ISN'T**,
WE **AREN'T**,
YOU **AREN'T**,
THEY **AREN'T**.

INTERROGATIVE.

AM I? Yes, I am!
No, I'm not!
ARE YOU? Yes, you are!
No, you aren't.
IS HE? Yes, he is!
No, he isn't.
IS SHE? Yes, she is!
No, she isn't.
IS IT? Yes, it is!
No, it isn't.
ARE WE? Yes, we are!
No, we aren't.
ARE YOU? Yes, you are!
No, you aren't.
ARE THEY? Yes, they are!
No, they aren't.
