When a verb ends with y, and there is a vowel before it, we simply add the letter s to the verb.

buy = buys = buys
say = says = says
pay = pays = pays

Subject + verb / present + Complement

I	Study	English
She	Studies	English
We	study	English

Negative statements

Subject + auxiliary (negative) + verb (infinitive) + Complement

I don't study English. / I do not study English.
She doesn't study English. / She does not study English.
We don't study English. / We do not study English.

Remember: for I/you/we/they: DO for She/He/It: DOES

- 2) Frank doesn't like dogs
- 3) My parents don't do the shopping
- 4) Sometimes we find ourselves in front of the cinema
- 5) The guy does not go to the doctor
- 6) Our friends don't play soccer in the park

- 9) We don't have the best ideas
- 10) Carol doesn't say goodbye
- 11) She doesn't love her best singer
- 12) My sister doesn't like
- 13) The children don't eat hamburgers

- 15) I don't arrive at home
