## Comparative

We use comparative adjective to show change or make comparisons

Example:

- ① this car is certainly better, but it's much more expensive
- ② I'm feeling happier now
- ③ we need a bigger garden

we use is two years older than me

New York is much bigger than Boston

he is a better player than Ronaldo

France is a bigger country than Britain

the Ballon got bigger and bigger  
everything is getting more and more  
expensive

Grand Father is looking older and older...

Adjective with one syllable.

First: usually if an adjective has only one syllable, we add "er" to make comparative form.

adjective

Comparative

Clean

Cleaner

Cold

Colder

Second: there are some spelling changes if there is one vowel followed by one consonant at the end of the adjective we often double the consonant

wet      wetter

big      bigger

Third: if the adjective ends in "y" this often changes to "i"

Dry

Fourth: If the adjective ends in 'e' we don't add another 'e' just 'r'

Nice      Nicer

Large      Larger

Five: there are a few adjectives that we use to use more even though they only have one syllable

Real — more real

Right — more right

## Adjectives with two SYLLables

for adjectives with two syllables we generally use more

careful more careful

bored more bored

But some two syllable adjectives can take er it's also fine to use more

Clever — Cleverer

Simple — Simpler

## Superlative

A superlative is the form of an adjective or an adverb used to compare three or more things. The superlative form of an adjective is used to show something has a quality to the greatest or least degree.

### Rules

- ① Adjectives with one or two syllables you have add est
- ② Adjective with one or two syllables

## Comparative

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A rock is heavier than a leaf

Our house is bigger than yours

The Princess is more beautiful than the witch

Tom is a better student than Mary

Bicycles are safer than motorbikes

July is hotter than January

A lion is more dangerous than a cat

Helen is happier than Mary

Computers are more expensive than telephones

I think golf is than football
