

Example:

Juan had spoken English with his friends.
Camilo had spoken French with his girlfriend.

Activity:

- 1.) Pablo had slept on the bed.
- 2.) Juan had run on the street.
- 3.) Sara had stolen to the teacher. (steal)
- 4.) Mary had taken a secret to her boyfriend.
- 5.) The doctor had spoken in a conference about the cancer.

Negative Sentence:

subject + had + NOT + verb (participle) + complement.

Example:

Juan had not spoken English with his friends.
Juan hadn't spoken English with his friends.

Activity:

- 1.) Pablo hadn't slept on the bed.
- 2.) Juan had not run on the street.
- 3.) Sara hadn't stolen to the teacher.
- 4.) Mary had not taken a secret to her boyfriend.
- 5.) The doctor hadn't spoken in a conference about the cancer.

Question form:

Had + Subject + verb (participle) + complement.

Example:

Had Juan spoken english with his friends?

Activity:

- 1) Had Pablo slept on the bed.
- 2) Had Juan run on the street.
- 3) Had Sara stolen to the teacher.
- 4) Had Mary taken a secret to her boyfriend.
- 5) Had The doctor spoken in a conference about the cancer.

Activity:

1. I thought I knew her. I thought I had seen her before. (see)
2. He had driven only twice in his life before the accident. (drive)
3. Bonny no longer had her car. She had sold it. (sell)
4. I saw Annabel last week. She had changed a lot. (change)
5. Terry wasn't at home. He had gone out. (go)
6. I tried to find Mr James but he wasn't around. Then I found out he had died. (die)
7. He didn't need to borrow the car because he had had his bike repaired. (have)
8. Jenny had gotten home when the phone rang. (get)
9. The new restaurant wasn't open any longer. It had closed down. (close)
10. He fed the cat because no-one had fed it for days. (feed)

Sentences:

1. I/work → I had worked.
2. He/paint → He had painted.
3. We/listen → We had listened.
4. You/speak → You had spoken.
5. They/find → They had found.

Sentences:

1. We ate cherries from the tree that my grandfather (plant) had planted many years before.
2. When we arrived, the show (start) had already started.
3. We went to a place where I (be) had never been before.
4. The teacher wanted to know whether we (read) had read.
5. Yesterday I met a friend that I (see) had not seen for ages.

Sentences:

1. Had your husband made dinner? when you got home?
2. Had Lisa finished her homework? when she went out with her friends?
3. Had you had breakfast? when you started to work?
4. What had he done? That made you so upset with him the other day?
5. Had she already moved to London? when she met her boyfriend?
