Negative

Subject + Auxiliary has/have + verb
in participle + complement

She
he — hasn't / has not
it

I
you — haven't / have not
we
They

- 1) They have not visited to London
- 2) She hasn't understood the lesson
- 3) we have not written an essay
- 4) I have not travelled to U.S.A
