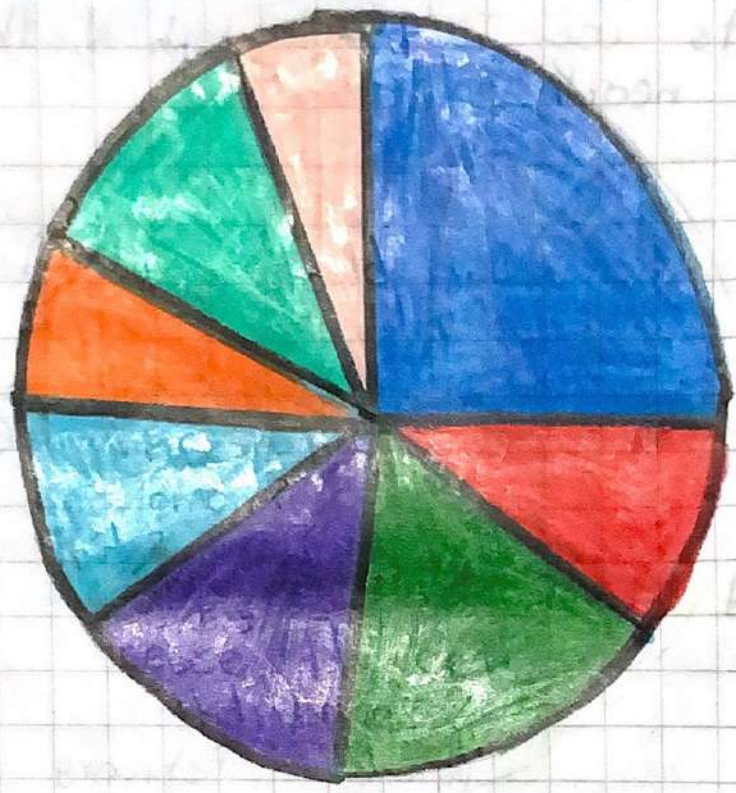

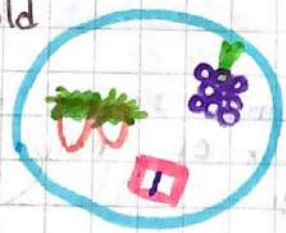
Sentences

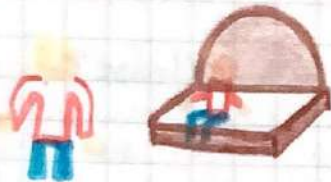

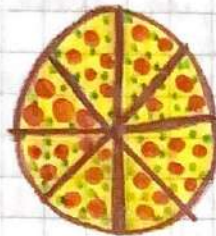

modal verbs

verb

- She should practice any sport
- You ought to check

Suggestions

- He shouldn't eat too much candy
- He ought not drink alcohol

negative suggestions

- (if were you) I would return the book.
- (if were you) I would do my homework first

opinion/hypothetical/advice

- what would you do? I wouldn't go there

Obligation and prohibition

Obligation

- I **must** **pay** the bills
- She **has to** **get** a driver license in her job

Prohibition

- I **mustn't** **use** the cell phone while driving

Lack of necessity

- you **don't have to** **wear** a uniform at the university.
- We **don't have to** **pay** the concert is free.

Possibility

- I ^(me) **may** **be** home late
- She **might** **study** at the university
