It is a verb tense which is used to show that a complete action took place at a specific time in the past. The simple past is also frequently used to talk about past habits and generalizations.

Example: Carol played soccer with his friends yesterday. Peter studied English the last year.

Luisa ate rice with milk the last week.

- Use the past tense to talk about
1. Something that happened once in the past
 2. Something that happened again and again in the past
 3. Something that was true for some time in the past

Example: I lived abroad for ten years. He enjoyed being a student.

She played a lot of tennis when she was younger.

I spoke with my friend Ana last night.

AFFIRMATIVE

Rick **was** fat last year.
They **were** schoolmates ten years ago.

NEGATIVE

Rick **wasn't** fat last year.
They **weren't** schoolmates ten years ago.
Was Rick fat last year?

INTERROGATIVE

Were they schoolmates ten years ago?
Yes, they **were**.
No, they **weren't**.
