We make the third conditional by using the past perfect after 'if' and then 'would have' past participle in the second part of the sentence:

if + past perfect, ...would + have + past participle

| If clause | Main clause |
|-------------------------|---------------------------------------|
| If + Past Perfect tense | would/could/might + have + participle |
| If I had... | I would have traveled around... |
| ... | ...didn't happen, an... |

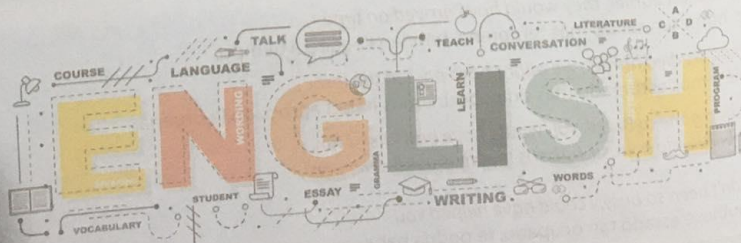
