Post Perfect

The past perfect tense is for talking about something that happened before something else

Example

We were shocked to discover that **someone had graffiti'd on our front door**

The past perfect, also called the pluperfect, is a verb tense used to talk about actions that were completed before some point in the past

The teacher explain about past perfect **while** the student had done the test

after sofia had finished her work, she went to lunch

past perfect: Sofia

past simple: she

I washed the floor when the painter had gone

past perfect the painter

past simple: I washed

Affirmative sentences

subject + had + verb (participle) + complement

Juan had spoken english with his friends

Ca ura and Peter had eaten pizza

Jhon had written a poem

1 You had slept on the bed

Negative form

subject + had + NOT + verb (participle) + ...

Juan had Not (spoken english with his friends

They had Not written to family a letter about their situation

- 3 Sara had not stolen to the teacher
- 4 Mary had not told a secret to her boyfriend
- 5 The doctor hadn't spoken in the conference about the cancer
