If you get used to something, you become accustomed to it,
it is not longer weird or strange.

Structure

used to + verb Infinitive

Refers to a habit or state in the past. It is used only in the past simple

- 1 Paulo used to speak French
- 2 Jean used to sleep early
- 3 She used to Read a book
- 4 He used to play Guitar
- 5 Karol used to ~~abroad~~ Travel abroad
- 6 Camila used to pay My bills
- 7 I used to fight with my friends
- 8 I used to Go to the Shopping
- 9 Maria used to eat Rice
- 10 Daniel used to ~~eat~~ Listen to the Radio.
