Metaphorical: a figure of speech in which a word or phrase is applied to an object or action that is not literally meant to refer to itself, usually to make a comparison.

Rhetorical: rhetoric is a technique of using language effectively and persuasively in spoken or written form.

Formal: the definition of formal language is a language that is used in formal situations. It is a language that is not colloquial, and it is a language that is used in formal situations.

Colloquial: colloquial language is a language that is used in informal situations. It is a language that is not formal, and it is a language that is used in informal situations.
