It is used when we refer to a place and is placed after the noun referring to the place.



The box where the old toys are in the garage.      That library, where I used to go after school, is going to be restored.

**WHEN**  
It is used when we refer to a period of time. It is placed after the noun referring to the period of time.



I still remember the day when you proposed.      The year 2010, when I went to study abroad, was the best of my life.
