

This verb tense follow this structure:

He  
She  
It  
+ has + past participle...  
Example: She has traveled to Europe two times.

I  
We  
You  
They  
+ have + past participle...  
Example: They have gone fishing.

Note: for questions, the order of the elements change in the following way:  
Example: Have you eaten lobster? - Yes, I have. / No, I haven't.  
Example: Has Diego visited Arenal Volcano? - Yes, he has. / No, he hasn't.
