- · Come here at once!
- Take that gum out of your mouth!

GIVE INSTRUCTIONS

- Take one pill every 12 hours.
- Open your books on page 33.

ON SIGNS

- · Push
- · Pull
- Give way
- · Stay on your right

GIVE WARNINGS

- Don't sit on the bench! I't's wet paint.
- Don't smoke! It's bad for your health.

MAKE AN INVITATION

- · Have some tea. It's still hot.
- Come in and sit down. We are having tea.

GIVE ADVICE

- Go home and get some sleep. You look exhausted.
- Tell me about your trip to Ireland.
