Question or Interrogative form

Affirmative sentence: Juan plays soccer every day

Negative sentence: Juan doesn't play soccer every day

Question: **Does** Juan play soccer every day?

Affirmative sentence: I love my new car

Negative sentence: I don't love my new car

Question: do I love my new car?

Affirmative sentence: Peter and Walter travel to China.

Negative sentence: Peter and Walter don't travel to China.

Question: do Peter and Walter travel to China?
