

All the auxiliary verbs except be, do and have are called modals. Unlike other auxiliary verbs modals only exist in their helping form; they cannot act alone auxiliary verbs modals only exist in their helping form; they cannot act alone as the main verb in a sentence.

USES

General ability. Request.

General ability in the past. Request.

Asking for permission Possibility.

To give advice, a recommendation or a suggestion.

EXAMPLE

They can control their own budgets.

We can't fix it.

Can I smoke here?

Could I borrow your dictionary?
Could you say it again more slowly?
We could try to fix it ourselves.
I think we could have another Gulf War.
He gave up his old job so he could
work for us.

May I have another cup of coffee? China may become a major economic power.

You really should go to the new restaurant on Main Street.

I think you should study for the test so that you don't fail.

USES

Used as a polite invitation or to offer. Describe a prediction (hypothetical situations).

To not sound impolite when disagreeing with someone.

Shows us that the obligation comes from somebody else. It's a law or a rule and the speaker can't change it.

Shows us that the obligation comes from the speaker. It isn't a law or a rule.

EXAMPLE

Would you like to go to the movies with me tonight?

It would be nice to have a barbecue.

I wouldn't agree with that.

We have to complete this activity by
Friday.
In Britain you have to buy a TV license
every year.

I must memorize all of these rules about modal verbs.
I must call my dad tonight.


