Post perfect ↑

The teacher explained about past perfect while the student had done the test.

The past perfect, also called the pluperfect, is a verb tense used to talk about actions that were completed before some point in the past.

Affirmative Sentences

Subject + had + Verb + Complement
Participle

Jua had spoken English with his friend
