Ability

We use can and can't to talk about someone's skill or general abilities.

She can speak several languages
 He can swim like a fish
 They can't dance very well

We use can and can't to talk about the ability to do something at a specific time in the present or future

I can see you
 Help I can't breathe

Permission

We use can to ask for permission to do something

Can I ask a question, please?
 Can we go home now?
