Present simple is formed by the
Subject, Verb and Complement

Shakira sings so well

The only variation is in the third person
(She, He and IT) Because you have
to add "S" "ES" "IES"

Rule 1

You have to add s third person + s
it.

Rule 2

When a verb ends with o s ch, sh, z, we add the es

Rule 3

When a verb ends with "y" and there is a consonant before it, the "y" changes into "ies"

Rule 4

When a verb ends with y, and there is a vowel before it, we simply add the letter s to the verb
