In negative sentences we put the frequency adverb between the auxiliary don't or doesn't and the main verb.  
 Subject + don't / doesn't + frequency adverb + main verb + (complement)



I don't **often** watch TV.



He doesn't **usually** go shopping.

In interrogative sentences, the frequency adverb will be placed between the subject and the main verb.



Do you **always** go to university by bus?



Do you **usually** travel?
