Past perfect.

Example - I wrote a letter. (past simple)
- I will travel to USA. (future simple)
- I have travelled to USA. (present perfect)

I had travelled to USA. (past perfect.)

I wrote a letter when my mother had arrived
to home. (past simple) (past perfect)

The past perfect tense is for talking about something that happened before something else.
Example we were shocked to discover that someone had graffitied our front door.

past simple: We were shocked to discover
past perfect: someone had graffitied on our front door

The teacher explained about past perfect while the student had done the test.

past simple: The teacher explained about past perfect
past perfect: The student had done the test

Activity.

The past perfect simple is used to describe one action that happened before another action the last.

After Jodie had finished her work, she went to lunch.

past simple: She had finished
past perfect: She went to lunch

I washed the floor when the painter had gone

past simple: I washed the floor
past perfect: The painter had gone

Affirmative Sentences

Subject + had + Verb (participle) + complement

Jan has spoken English with his friends.
They had written to family a letter about their situation
Laura / eat

Laura and Peter had eaten pizza

Regular verb

Irregular verb

present walk

present eat

past walked

past ate

participle walked

participle eaten

Example Susan had walked for two days
I had ate rice
She had written a poem

Negative Form

Subject + had + NOT + Verb (participle) + complement

Jan had not spoken English with his friends
They had NOT written to family a letter about their situation
Jan hadn't spoken English with his friends

You can write Had not or Hadn't.

Laura / understand / the lesson
Laura had not understood the lesson
