

This verb tense follow this structure:

He  
She  
It + has + past participle...

Example: She has traveled to Europe two times.

I  
We + have + past participle...

They have gone fishing.

**Note:** for questions, the order of the elements change in the following way:

Example: Have you eaten lobster? - Yes, I have. / No, I haven't.

Example: Has Diego visited Arenal Volcano? - Yes, he has. / No, he hasn't.

Maria's dog, Sparky, has never played in the snow. This is Sparky's first snow. He **has not** (not/ feel) the cold yet.

Maria **has just receive** (just/ receive) a new sled for Christmas. She puts on her warm clothes and snow boots. She pulls the sled up the hill. Sparky **has ran** (run) outside with Maria. Sparky **followed** (follow) Maria up the hill. He feels good!

Maria **has reach finished** (finally - reach) the top. She sits on her sled. She rides down the hill. Sparky runs beside the sled. They have finally reached the bottom. Sparky **followed** (follow) Maria all the way down the hill. Sparky **has decided** (decide) that he likes the snow too!
